#### Invitation/Challenge

Some things in life are not what they seem: my son has salt and pepper pots that look like penguins, or we were given a bottle opener that looks like Gromit.

Some people are not quite who we assume them to be either. Jesus looked like a travelling preacher and he was, he slept wherever people invited him to stay, he wore the ordinary clothes of the very ordinary people of his day. But he was also a King and when he talked about being a king, then people found it hard to believe. He was not a king who had servants but one who served anyone who would let him. It's no wonder they struggled to understand.

I wonder what difference he has made to you and your life.
