- **Narrowboat Day Trip Wednesday 27th May & Saturday 6th June**

I have provisionally arranged a day trip on 2 narrowboats for those who are interested in enjoying a trip along the canal. Each narrowboat holds up to 12 people, one boat allowing for up to 2 wheelchairs (if required). The journey begins at 10am with a return at 4pm approximately and will cost £10 per person (providing all places are utilised). All ages are welcome. Each boat has toilet facilities and a small kitchen area to allow the making of hot drinks. The trip will go from Canal Street, Nottingham (2 minute walk from Nottingham Station) up to Beeston Heritage Centre and back. Refreshments for drinks will be included within the price. You can either bring a packed lunch or purchase this from the Heritage Centre.
